The RNRMC Charity Champion role is open to serving members of the Royal Navy, Royal Marines, RN Reserves, RM Reserves and URNUs. Supporting our small Fundraising and Engagement team, Charity Champions will help to raise the profile of RNRMC at their ship, unit, base, or squadron as well as within their local communities by sharing key messages and pro-actively engaging in, and promoting campaigns, fundraising events, volunteer opportunities and payroll giving.

Regularly, ideally 1-2 hours per week and up to three events per year.

- Feel comfortable in delivering PowerPoint presentations
- Be a team player with an approachable and cooperative attitude

- Have experience of fundraising or events
- Already support RNRMC's payroll giving scheme

What will your main responsibilities be?

- Act as a representative and point of contact for RNRMC
- Liaise with RNRMC Charity Champion Engagement Officer and Regional Volunteer Lead
- Promote RNRMC key messages and understand support available from RNRMC and related charities
- Promote Payroll Giving and encourage sign ups
- Promote RNRMC campaigns
- Arrange fundraising activities and encourage fundraising amongst ship's company
- Contact RNRMC pre-deployment for all charity assets
- Help arrange RNRMC briefs and represent RNRMC at families' days and events
- Liaise with PRO and RNRMC Comms to provide photos and case studies of fundraising activities and impact of grants received, ensuring required photo permissions are obtained
- Effectively manage the distribution of collection pots in accordance with RNRMC policy
- Ensure monies raised correctly recorded and passed to RNRMC
- Ensure all activities comply with Fundraising Code of Conduct and GDPR
